ENTRIES CLOSE ON Wednesday 22nd January, 2025

ENTRY FEES: BHPA MEMBER \$25 class / BHPA NON-MEMBER \$30 class

POST ENTRIES – Double regular entry fee

SCHOOLING: \$15

ADMINISTRATION FEE: \$25 for each horse/pony entered in the show

JUMP CREW FEE: \$20 for each horse/pony entered in the show (to cover cost of jump crew and course build)

Entries will be received preferably:

- Pay online to the BHPA Account: Bank of N.T. Butterfield, Account Number 20-006-060-055546-100. Please REMEMBER to identify the entry you are paying for and put your payment reference where indicated on the entry form.

Enter the correct horse/pony registration number on the entry form where required as well as the BEF membership number of the rider. The age and date of birth of a junior competitor is also required. Entry forms without this information may not be accepted.

REFUNDS - A 50% refund will be given upon receipt of a Dr.'s or Vet Certificate

Post entries will be accepted prior to the first warning call for the particular class.

HORSE SHOW RULES

1. All horses and ponies must be registered with, and competitors must be members of, the BEF prior to the close of entries.
2. The age of a junior competitor will be taken as of September 1, 2022. A junior competitor shall be under 19 years.
3. The organizing committee reserves the right to change, cancel or combine classes or to deny inappropriate entries, if they have reason to do so.
4. Competitors should be neatly and suitably attired in coat, hunt cap with harness. Refer to BEF Rule Book for further details on dress.
5. Any cruelty or abuse, whether it is physical, verbal or otherwise, directed at any horse, person, or show official, will result in immediate elimination of the entry concerned.
6. Fences in the warm-up ring must be jumped in the direction indicated by the red and white flags when indicated.
7. No person shall have any contact, direct or indirect, with any part of the fences in the main ring or the warm-up ring, while a horse or pony is jumping. Rapping a horse will result in elimination. No false ground lines may be used.
8. Substitutions are allowed as follows: Riders may be substituted without post entry charges. A new horse/pony in any class is a post entry. All requests for changes must be directed to the Show Secretary.
9. Any situation or condition not covered by the rules of the BEF will be decided by the Show Director.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Table A –

Faults penalised in Penalty points or by elimination according to the following table:

Obstacle knocked down by jumping	4 Penalties
First Disobedience	4 Penalties
Second Disobedience	Elimination in competitions >1m (or 4 Penalties)
Third disobedience	Elimination in competitions 1m or higher
Fall of horse or rider (or both)	Elimination
Exceeding the time limit	Elimination
Exceeding the time allowed under Table A	1 Penalty for each second commenced

Commonly used Table A (or USEF Equivalent) competition wording:

Table A Art 238.1.2 – Competition not against the clock with a time allowed but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties in the first round.

Table A Speed Art 238.2.1 – Competition against the clock. Athletes with equality of Penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of Penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule.

USEF JP150 - The rotating pair relay consists of a team of 2 riders. The entire course is jumped twice. The team chooses how they want to divide the course into sections, but the fences must be jumped in the correct order. One change of rider is mandatory. Each rider must jump at least 2 jumps. Competitors may change over as often as they wish. A change is obligatory when a fault is incurred. A disobedience is indicated by an audible signal at which time the other competitor must first jump the obstacle which has not been jumped by his partner and then continue the course. Knock downs incurred are penalized by adding four seconds for each occurrence to the time of the round. Disobediences are penalized only by time. (Three refusals permitted prior to elimination – per local rule.) Should a competitor jump an obstacle before his partner has landed over preceding obstacle, the pair will be eliminated. Both riders enter the ring, after the tone the first rider begins their section. (If team member 1 has a knockdown at fence 3 team member 2 must jump fence 4. If team member 1 has a stop at fence 3 team member 2 must jump fence 3.). The fastest overall time wins. In case of a tie for first place there will be a jump off over a shortened course.

FEI Art 270 - Competitors may jump any obstacles they wish in any order and in any direction during a fixed time. Each obstacle carries from 10 to 120 points according to its difficulty. Combinations are not allowed. At the end of the time allowed, the competitor must cross the finish line in order for their time to be recorded. Each obstacle may be jumped twice. The competitor with the highest number of points will be declared the winner (fastest time will decide in the event of equality of points). An obstacle may be provided as part of the course, duly marked by flags and called "Joker". The Joker may be jumped twice; 200 points are awarded each time this obstacle is jumped correctly, but if it is knocked down, 200 points must be deducted from the total points.

Sections open to Junior and Adult exhibitors.

Class 1 - Open Jumping 1.00m (JP05) – Table A Art 238.1.2

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 1.0m (3'3"). Competition not against the clock with a time allowed but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties in the first round. Combinations are expected to form part of the course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points for this division will not separate horses or ponies.

Class 2 - Open Jumping 1.05m (JP05) – Table A Speed Art 238.2.1

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 1.05m (3'44"). Competition against the clock. Athletes with equality of Penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of Penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule. Combinations are expected to form part of the course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points for this division will not separate horses or ponies.

Class 3 - Open Jumping 1.10m (JP06) – Table A Art 238.1.2

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 1.10m (3'6"). Competition not against the clock with a time allowed but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties in the first round. Combinations are expected to form part of the course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points for this division will not separate horses or ponies.

Class 4 - Open Jumping 1.15m (JP07) – Table A Speed Art 238.2.1

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 1.15m (3'44"). Competition against the clock. Athletes with equality of Penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of Penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule. Combinations are expected to form part of the course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points for this division will not separate horses or ponies.

Class 5 - Open Jumping 1.20m (JP07) – Table A Art 238.1.2

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 1.20m (3'9"). Competition not against the clock with a time allowed but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties in the first round. Combinations are expected to form part of the course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points for this division will not separate horses or ponies.

Class 6 - Open Jumping 1.30m (JP08) – Table A Art 238.1.2

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 1.30m (4'3"). Competition not against the clock with a time allowed but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties in the first round. Combinations are expected to form part of the course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points for this division will not separate horses or ponies.

Class 7 - Open Jumping 0.65m (JP02 A/B) – Table A Art 238.1.2

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 0.65m (2'1"). Competition not against the clock with a time allowed but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties in the first round. No combinations will be on course. BEF Championship points will be awarded to horses (JP02A) and ponies (JP02B) separately.

Class 8 - Open Jumping 0.70m (JP03 A/B) – Table A Art 238.1.2

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 0.7m (2'3"). Competition not against the clock with a time allowed but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties in the first round. Combinations may be permitted on course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points will be awarded to horses (JP03A) and ponies (JP03B) separately.

Class 9 - Open Jumping 0.75m (JP03 A/B) – Table A Speed Art 238.2.1

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 0.75m (2'45"). Competition against the clock. Athletes with equality of Penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of Penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule. Combinations may be permitted on course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points will be awarded to horses (JP03A) and ponies (JP03B) separately.

Class 10 - Open Jumping 0.80m (JP04) – Table A Art 238.1.2

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 0.80m (2'6"). Competition not against the clock with a time allowed but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties in the first round. Combinations are expected to form part of the course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points for this division will not separate horses or ponies.

Class 11 - Rotating Pair Relay Jumping – USEF JP150

Height of fences not to exceed 0.85m (2'79"). The rotating pair relay consists of a team of 2 riders. The entire course is jumped twice. The team chooses how they want to divide the course into sections, but the fences must be jumped in the correct order. One change of rider is mandatory. Each rider must jump at least 2 jumps. Competitors may change over as often as they wish. A change is obligatory when a fault is incurred. A disobedience is indicated by an audible signal at which time the other competitor must first jump the obstacle which has not been jumped by his partner and then continue the course. Knock downs incurred are penalized by adding four seconds for each occurrence to the time of the round. Disobediences are penalized only by time. (Three refusals permitted prior to elimination – per local rule.) Should a competitor jump an obstacle before his partner has landed over preceding obstacle, the pair will be eliminated. Both riders enter the ring, after the tone the first rider begins their section. (If team member 1 has a knockdown at fence 3 team member 2 must jump fence 4. If team member 1 has a stop at fence 3 team member 2 must jump fence 3.). The fastest overall time wins. In case of a tie for first place there will be a jump off over a shortened course.

Class 12 - Open Jumping 0.90m (JP04) – Table A Art 238.1.2

Open jumping class where the height of fences is not to exceed 0.90m (2'95"). Competition not against the clock with a time allowed but in the event of equality of Penalties for first place there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other Athletes are placed according to their Penalties in the first round. Combinations are expected to form part of the course but must be adjusted to accommodate for ponies and horses competing in the same class. BEF Championship points for this division will not separate horses or ponies.

Class 13 - GAMBLER'S CHOICE (TOP SCORE) JUMPING Height not to exceed 0.95m – FEI Art 270

Competitors may jump any obstacles they wish in any order and in any direction during a fixed time. Each obstacle carries from 10 to 120 points according to its difficulty. Combinations are not allowed. At the end of the time allowed, the competitor must cross the finish line in order for their time to be recorded. Each obstacle may be jumped twice. The competitor with the highest number of points will be declared the winner (fastest time will decide in the event of equality of points). An obstacle may be provided as part of the course, duly marked by flags and called "Joker". The Joker may be jumped twice; 200 points are awarded each time this obstacle is jumped correctly, but if it is knocked down, 200 points must be deducted from the total points.
