When paying online you must identify yourself with your payment by horse name, you must also indicate the amount paid and confirmation number on your entry form. All payments must be done before the start of show.

RULES

- 1.All horses and ponies must be registered with, and competitors must be members of, the BEF prior to the close of entries.
- 2. Correct money for each class must accompany entry form.
- 3. The organizing committee reserves the right to change, cancel or combine classes or to deny inappropriate entries if they have reason to do so.
- 4. Competitors should be neatly and suitably attired in coat, hunt cap with harness. Refer to BEF Rule Book for further details on dress.
- 5. Any cruelty or abuse, whether it is physical, verbal or otherwise, directed at any horse, person, or official of the show, will result in immediate elimination by the organizing committee. Refer to BEF Codes of Conduct.
- 6. Fences in the warm-up ring must be jumped in the direction indicated by the red & white flags when indicated.
- 7. No person shall have any contact, direct or indirect, with any part of the fences in the main ring or the warm-up ring, while a horse or pony is jumping. Rapping a horse will result in elimination. No false ground lines may be used.
- 8. Any situation or condition not covered by the rules of the BEF will be decided by the Show Director.
- 9. To be eligible for a division championship, all classes of the division must be entered at the time of close of entries which in turn must be indicated on the Entry Form. Post entries will be considered for division championships but there will be an additional fee of \$10 plus the charge for the Post Entry.
- 10. Withdrawal of entries refer to BEF Rule Book. Any subsequent requests for changes must be directed to the Show Secretary.
- 11. List of requirements from which a judge may choose for an individual test in equitation classes may be found in the BEF Rule Book.
- 12. Jumping classes will be held under USEF Rules, for BEF points.

- A championship and reserve ribbon will be awarded at the end of each division.
- Division Championships will be determined by the highest number of points awarded to a horse or rider as applicable.
- Division Championships require you to ride in both Over fences and under saddle.

ENTRIES

- Enter the correct horse/pony registration number on the entry form where required as well as the BEF membership number of the rider. The age and date of birth of a junior competitor is also required. Entry forms without this information may not be accepted.
- Post entries will be accepted prior to the start of a class as provided in the BEF Rules.
- The age of a junior competitor will be taken as of September 1, 2024. A junior competitor shall be under 19 years.

FEES

ENTRY FEES - \$25 per class

POST ENTRIES – \$50 per class - plus \$10 if post entering a show division championship class.

SCHOOLING: \$20 per horse per round (Payment in advance or on the field). Tickets must be purchased from Announcers Booth prior to schooling.

ADMINISTRATION FEE: \$30 for each horse/pony entered in the show

JUMP FEE: \$30 for each horse/pony entered in the show.

CLASS 1- SCHOOLING UP TO 3'6

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

8:00 am START

CLASS 2 – BEF OPEN EQ HUNT SEAT MEDAL (EQ17):

Class to be run in two phases, to run consecutively. Phase 1 will be judged over a hunter type course with a minimum of 8 jumps including 1 combination, an oxer and a change of lead. Height of fences not to exceed 3'6". The course may contain the following: Bending line, narrow jump, roll back turn, long approach to single jump. May also include in the course test(s) from the BEF rule book 1-8,10,13, or 14. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not considered unless it is deemed at the judge's discretion to be the result of a rider error or ability. An open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. Those not eliminated in the over fences phase if this class will be asked to return to the ring for phase 2, the flat phase, where they will be tested at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. They may also be asked to perform either individually or collectively any test or combination of tests from the BEF rule book 1-18. The top 4 competitors may then be asked to do additional testing either on the flat or over fences at the judge's discretion. Tack and equipment must be in accordance with the BEF rules for equitation. Boots and bandages and standing martingales are permitted in the jumping phase but must be removed prior to returning to the ring for the flat phase. Distance changes may be made to any related distance on course where the related distance between two fences is less than 58' 0" to accommodate for juniors competing on ponies.

CLASS 3 - SCHOOLING 3'0"

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal manner and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 4 – EQUITATION MEDAL UP TO 3' OVER FENCES

The ability of the rider will be judged over 2 phases. Phase 1 will be judged over a course of a minimum of 8 jumps including 1 combination, an oxer and a change of lead. Height of fences not to exceed 3'. The course may contain the following: bending line, narrow jump, roll back turn, long approach to single jump. May also include in the course tests from the BEF rule book 1-9, 10, 13 or 14. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability, which is at the judges discretion. Those not eliminated in the over fences phase of this class will be asked to return to the ring for the flat, phase 2. In phase 2, you will be tested at the walk, trot and canter and may be asked to perform either individually or collectively, and test or combination of tests, from the BEF rule book 1-8, 10, 13 or 14. The top 4 competitors may be then asked to do additional testing either on the flat or over fences. Tack and equipment must be in accordance with the BEF rules for equitation. Boots and bandages and standing martingales are permitted in the jumping phase but must be removed prior to returning to the ring for the plat phase. Riders may compete on horses or ponies. Distance changes may be made to any related distances on course where the related distance between the fence is less that 58' 0" to accommodate for riders competing on ponies at the discretion of the judge and course designer.

CLASS 5 - SCHOOLING 2'9

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 6 – OPEN EQUITATION UP TO 2'9 OVER FENCES (EQ16)

Open to adults 19 years or older. Height of fences not to exceed 2'9. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. To be shown over a course of not less than eight (8) obstacles. The course must include one combination which includes an oxer and two changes of direction after the first obstacle.

CLASS 7 – OPEN EQUITATION UP TO 2'9 UNDER SADDLE (EQ16)

To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Entries may be asked to change mounts and/or to do an individual show. May be asked to perform Tests 1-18 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. Two or more tests of the top four competitors is encouraged. May not enter any other BEF Equitation rated class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 8 - SCHOOLING 2'6

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 9 - J/A - MODIFIED EQUITATION 2'6 OVER FENCES (EQ15 J/A)

Jumps cannot exceed 2'6 and wings must be at least 30" wide. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited to be ridden by juniors. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship. If you are entering as a JUNIOR enter Class 8J, if you are entering as an ADULT enter Class 8A. Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.

CLASS 10 - J/A - MODIFIED EQUITATION 2'6 UNDER SADDLE (EQ15 J/A)

The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. To be judged at a walk, Trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform B.E.F. Equitation Tests 1,3-6,8,10 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship If you are entering as a JUNIOR enter Class 9J, if you are entering as an ADULT enter Class 9A. **Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.**

CLASS 11 - EQUITATION MEDAL UP TO 2'6" OVER FENCES

The ability of the rider will be judged over 2 phases. Phase 1 will be judged over a course of a minimum of 8 jumps including 1 combination, an oxer and a change of lead. Height of fences not to exceed 2'6". The course may contain the following: bending line, narrow jump, roll back turn, long approach to single jump. May also include in the course tests from the BEF rule book 1-8. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability, which is at the judges discretion. Those not eliminated in the over fences phase of this class will be asked to return to the ring for the flat, phase 2. In phase 2, you will be tested at the walk, trot and canter and may be asked to perform either individually or collectively, and test or combination of tests, from the BEF rule book 1-8. The top 4 competitors may be then asked to do additional testing either on the flat or over fences. Tack and equipment must be in accordance with the BEF rules for equitation. Boots and bandages and standing martingales are permitted in the jumping phase but must be removed prior to returning to the ring for the plat phase. Riders may compete on horses or ponies. Distance changes may be made to any related distances on course where the related distance between the fence is less that 58' 0" to accommodate for riders competing on ponies at the discretion of the judge and course designer.

CLASS 12 - SCHOOLING 2'3

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 13 J/A -LOW EQUITATION 2'3 OVER FENCES (EQ14 J/A)

Jumps cannot exceed .2'3 and wings must be at least 30" wide. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited to be ridden by juniors. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship. If you are entering as a JUNIOR enter Class 12J, if you are entering as an ADULT enter Class 12A. Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.

CLASS 14 J/A - LOW EQUITATION 2'3 UNDER SADDLE (EQ14 J/A)

The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. To be judged at a walk, Trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform B.E.F. Equitation Tests 1,3-6,8,10. of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship. If you are entering as a JUNIOR enter Class 13J, if you are entering as an ADULT enter Class 13A. **Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.**

CLASS 15 - SCHOOLING 18"

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 16 J/A – SHORT STIRRUP (18") JUNIORS & ADULTS (EQ 13 J/A)

Jumps cannot exceed 18" and wings must be at least 30" wide. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited to be ridden by juniors. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship. If you are showing as a junior competitor, please enter Class 15J, and if you are showing as an adult competitor, please enter Class 15A. Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.

CLASS 17 J/A - SHORT STIRRUP (18") UNDER SADDLE JUNIORS & ADULTS (EQ13 J/A)

The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. To be judged at a walk, Trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform B.E.F. Equitation Tests 1,3-6,8,10. of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship. If you are showing as a junior competitor, please enter Class 16J, and if you are showing as an adult competitor, please enter Class 16A. Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.

CLASS 18 - MINI EQUITATION MEDAL UP TO 2'3" OVER FENCES

The ability of the rider will be judged over 2 phases. Phase 1 will be judged over a course of a minimum of 8 jumps including 1 combination, an oxer and a change of lead. Height of fences not to exceed 2'3". The course may contain the following: bending line, narrow jump, roll back turn, long approach to single jump. May also include in the course tests from the BEF rule book 1-8. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability, which is at the judges discretion. Those not eliminated in the over fences phase of this class will be asked to return to the ring for the flat, phase 2. In phase 2, you will be tested at the walk, trot and canter and may be asked to perform either individually or collectively, and test or combination of tests, from the BEF rule book 1-8. The top 4 competitors may be then asked to do additional testing either on the flat or over fences. Tack and equipment must be in accordance with the BEF rules for equitation. Boots and bandages and standing martingales are permitted in the jumping phase but must be removed prior to returning to the ring for the plat phase. Riders may compete on horses or ponies. Distance changes may be made to any related distances on course where the related distance between the fence is less that 58'0" to accommodate for riders competing on ponies at the discretion of the judge and course designer.

CLASS 19 – LEAD LINE EQUITATION over poles (EQ10)

To be ridden over a course off jumps to consist of no more than 8 fences not to exceed pole in height. To be judged at a walk and trot only, with the ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 20 – LEAD LINE EQUITATION UNDER SADDLE (EQ10)

To be judged at a walk and trot only, with the ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the B.E.F. Equitation Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 21 - SCHOOLING X RAILS

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 22 – EQUITATION over x rails WALK & TROT (EQ11)

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 23 – WALK & TROT EQUITATION UNDER SADDLE (EQ11)

To be judged at a walk and trot only. The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the B.E.F. Equitation Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 24 - SCHOOLING 3'0

THIS IS A JUDGED SCHOOLING. You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 25 – HUNTER 3'0 OVER FENCES (HU23)

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 1.00M. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, and suitability. May not cross-enter any other BEF designated hunter class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 26 – HUNTER HANDY 3'0 OVER FENCES (HU23)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 1.00M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 14A, but the course requires an in-and-out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2

changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, manoeuvrability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 27 - HUNTER 3'0 UNDER SADDLE (HU23)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Judge may ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability, and manners. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 28 - SCHOOLING 2'9

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 29 – HUNTER 2'9 OVER FENCES (HU22)

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 0.90M. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, and suitability. May not cross-enter any other BEF designated hunter class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 30 - HUNTER HANDY 2'9 OVER FENCES (HU22)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed .90M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 14A, but the course requires an in-and-out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, manoeuvrability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 31 – HUNTER 2'9 UNDER SADDLE (HU22)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Judge may ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability, and manners. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 32 - SCHOOLING 2'6

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 33 P/H - HUNTER 2'6 OVER FENCES (HU21)

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 0.80M. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, and suitability. May not cross-enter any other BEF designated hunter class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship. If you are entering this class on a PONY, enter Class 32P, if you are entering on a HORSE enter Class 32H. **Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.**

CLASS 34 P/H – HUNTER HANDY 2'6 OVER FENCES (HU21)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 0.80M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 14A, but the course requires an in-and-out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, manoeuvrability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship. After entries are closes class will be split by ponies and horses. If you are entering this class on a PONY, enter Class 33P, if you are entering on a HORSE enter Class 33H. Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.

CLASS 35 P/H – HUNTER 2'6 UNDER SADDLE (HU21)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Judge may ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability, and manners. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship. If you are entering this class on a PONY, enter Class 34P, if you are entering on a HORSE enter Class 34H. Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.

CLASS 36 - RIDING HORSE 15.2HH & UNDER (OT25) - Entries to be shown under English saddle. Horses will enter the ring at walk and will be judge at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to hand gallop. Only eight (8) horses to gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, conformation, movement, substance and manners.

CLASS 37 – RIDING HORSE > 15.2HH (OT26) - Entries to be shown under English saddle. Horses will enter the ring at walk and will be judge at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to hand gallop. Only eight (8) horses to gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, conformation, movement, substance and manners.

CLASS 38 – RIDING PONY 14.2HH & UNDER (OT27) - Entries to be shown under English saddle. Ponies will enter the ring at walk and will be judge at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance, conformation, movement, substance and manners.

CLASS - 39 SCHOOLING X RAILS

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 40 - X-Rails Over-Fences (HU18)

To be shown at the trot or canter over a course of no less than 6 fences not to exceed 12" at the centre of the X. At least one change of direction is required. Combinations are not permitted. To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability & manners.

CLASS 41 -X-Rails Under-Saddle (HU18)

To be shown at a walk and trot both ways of the ring. Riders may be asked for an extended trot. Horses/Ponies are to stop easily, to back readily and stand quietly. Light contact with the pony's mouth is required. To be judge on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

CLASS 42 - Itty Bitty Hunter O/F (HU19)

To be shown at the canter over a course of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 18". Oxers not to exceed 18" in width are optional. At least one change of direction is required. Combinations are not permitted. To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability & manners.

CLASS 43 - Itty Bitty Hunter U/S (HU19)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Riders may be asked for an extended trot. Horses/Ponies are to stop easily, to back readily and stand quietly. Light contact is required. To be judge on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

CLASS 44 - SCHOOLING 2'3

You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 45 P/H - 2'3 Hunter O/F (HU20)

To be shown over a course of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 2'3". Oxers not to exceed 18" in width are optional. Combinations are not permitted. To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability & manners.

CLASS 46 P/H – HUNTER HANDY 2'3 OVER FENCES (HU20)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 0.80M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 44, but the course requires an in-and-out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, manoeuvrability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship. After entries are closes class will be split by ponies and horses. If you are entering this class on a PONY, enter Class 45P, if you are entering on a HORSE enter Class 45H. Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.

CLASS 47 P/H - 2'3 Hunter U/S (HU20)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Riders may be asked for an extended trot. Horses/Ponies are to stop easily, to back readily and stand quietly. Light contact is required. To be judge on performance, manners, suitability and soundness. If you are entering this class on a PONY, enter Class 46P, if you are entering on a HORSE enter Class 46H. Classes will run together but will be pinned separately.
